


29% of UK tech employees are women or non-binary






20% of software engineers are women or non-binary






21% of senior tech role holders are women or non-binary

... but only 1 in 4 organisations measures transidentity




1 in 4 tech employees are ethnic minorities...







... but this drops to just 14% of senior tech roles




9% of the tech workforce are from lower socio-economic backgrounds
